Rip Ford would say: "I was born in South Carolina. I moved to Texas and was a US soldier, a Texas Ranger, a newspaper owner, a lawyer, a Confederate Officer, a Texas Legislator, and Mayor of Brownsville. My troops in Texas won the last battle of the Civil War. My newspaper partner in Austin, Michael Cronican, opened the Western Texian Newspaper in San Antonio in 1848. Michael died in San Antonio in 1849. Frederick Remington interviewed me and sketched me in San Antonio in 1897. I died that year and am buried in San Antonio. We built things, we did not tear down history. The remarkable and historic monument the United Daughters of the Confederacy paid for and erected the following year, 1898, in the name and honor of my brave fellow soldiers was shamefully removed by the City Council in 2017 after 119 years. Honor your ancestors with a memorial of your own in the Heroes Dinner Program. **Lest We Forget**".
